2024 MCEA Advocate





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Between January 29 and February 16, 2024, MCEA members will have the opportunity to determine which path we as a union take in the future by electing colleagues to serve on the MCEA Board of Directors. The election will be conducted electronically. You will be sent a secure link via email and must vote by 5:00p.m. on February 16, 2024.

Seven (7) individuals put forth their names for the Elementary School Director, three (3) put forth their names for the High School Director, three (3) put forth their names for the Middle School Director and two (2) put forth their names for President. Only one (1) individual put their name forth for Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. Those three (3) positions were elected by acclimation. Pursuant to MCEA Election Guidelines 7.I, we will conduct an election for the Elementary School Director, High School Director, Middle School Director, and President during this month.

On the following pages, please find (if provided by the candidate) the bios and photographs for each candidate. If the candidate gave a speech at the January 3, 2024, Representative Assembly, that speech is linked in this document.

Members will have an opportunity to participate in directly asking questions of the candidates for president. We will hold a town hall meeting on Tuesday, January 23 at 6:00 p.m. via Zoom. Members are encouraged to watch via Zoom-- keep an eye on your email for the link. Anyone wishing to submit a question can do so by emailing them to MCEAelections@mceanea.org. To ask a question, you must identify yourself by name and work location or your question will not be asked of the candidates at the Town Hall.

Those elected will serve from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2027. Over the next three years, the winners of this internal MCEA election will oversee a negotiation reopener where we will attempt to, at a minimum, win a redesigned salary scale and improve staffing levels. They will also guide our union through public elections for board of education, county council, county executive, governor, state legislators, members of congress and senate, and president of the United States.

All dues-paying members may vote in all races. If you do not receive an online ballot, contact Jackie Thompson at jthompson@mceanea.org before close of business on Wednesday, February 14, 2024. Remember – the deadline to vote is 5:00p.m. on February 16, 2024.
